

TOWN OF RICHMOND DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) is a highly contagious and potentially fatal respiratory disease, the prevalence of which is increasing rapidly throughout the world, inclusive of the United States and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020, the Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts issued a Declaration of a State of Emergency to Respond to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization designated the COVID-19 outbreak a Pandemic Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States announced a national declaration of emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020, Governor Baker announced and updated the March 15, 2020 emergency actions to respond to the evolving COVID-19 public health emergency impacting the Commonwealth, including prohibitions on public gatherings of ten or more people, continuing to prohibit on-premises consumption of food or drink at bars and restaurants from March 17, 2020 until April 6, 2020, as well as suspension of elementary and secondary school educational operations from March 17, 2020 until April 6, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on Governor Baker announced additional public gathering limitations, travel advisories and suspension of elementary and secondary school educational operations until May 4, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Richmond Board of Selectmen in consultation with its Health Department and the State Department of Public Health, has determined that COVID-19 presents a major disaster which poses an immediate threat to public health, safety, and general welfare of people residing both within and outside of Richmond; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Richmond Board of Selectmen along with its Emergency Management Director have determined that immediate public action is needed in order to prevent or minimize the spread of COVID-19 by and among the people of Richmond; and

WHEREAS, it is critical to take additional steps to prepare for, respond to, and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 to protect the health and welfare of the people of Richmond; and

WHEREAS, declaring a state of emergency will facilitate and expedite the use of resources to protect persons from the impacts of COVID-19, including but not limited to emergency expenditures pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 31 and limitations on operating hours and access to public buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Board of Selectmen recommends that a state of emergency be declared in the Town of Richmond.

NOW THEREFORE, we, the Selectboard of the Town of Richmond, Massachusetts, hereby declare that as of March 15, 2020, a state of emergency exists in the Town of Richmond. This declaration of emergency shall remain in effect until further notice is given, pursuant to our judgment that the conditions leading to this declaration no longer exist.
